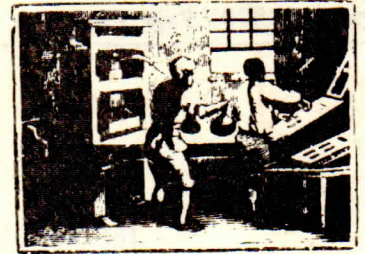

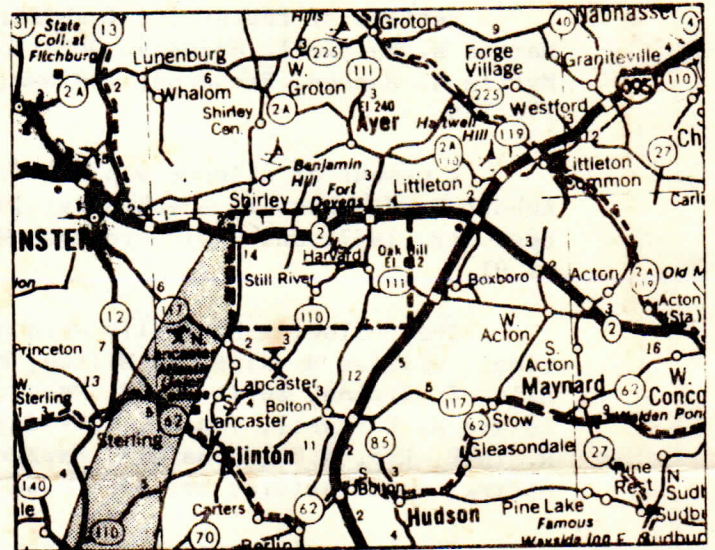

MINUTES OF 1978 MEETING

The 41st annual Hartwell Reunion was held June 24, 1978, in the Bedford Free Public Library, Bedford, Mass. with 60 members and guests attending.
